At EtonHouse, we view children as competent individuals. This is being put into practice by encouraging and teaching our children to be independent and responsible individuals. In the morning, children place their bags and shoes in their own cubby holes. During lunch time, children line up before heading out of the classroom. They serve their own food, in amounts that they can finish. Before going home, our children pack their own school bags and wear their own shoes.
